The HS MCC is a competition in European labour law. It is based on real court life situations and addresses the most challenging and topical issues.

The first case is based on the movement of workers through Europe and the question which wage they are entitled to and how and where they can claim this.

The HS MCC takes place in Amsterdam, at the end of June 2016. Pleas will be held for actual judges in three rounds spread over two days. Certificates for "eternal fame" will be awarded for the best team, the best written plea note and the best oral plea.

Participating countries for 2016 are: Belgium, Denmark, Georgia, Germany, Hungary, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland and Spain.
